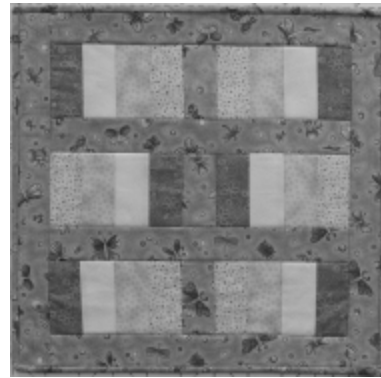

2008 Baby Doll Blanket #1

Size approx: 22"x22-1/2"

Fabric Requirements/Cutting Instructions

Fabrics for top:

Choose a single novelty main print. You need approx. four (4) 2-1/2" WOF strips. Sub-cut into two (2) pieces 2-1/2"x22", four (4) pieces 2-1/2"x18.5" and three (3) pieces 2-1/2"x5".

From a variety of novelty prints you need to cut a total of twenty-four (24) 2-1/2"x5" rectangles.

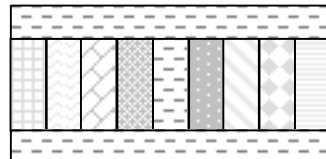
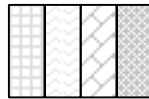
Backing: 1 piece 23"x23"

Batting: 1 piece 23"x23"

Binding: Three (3) 2-1/2" WOF strips.

Assembly

- Randomly sew four novelty print rectangles together along the 5" sides. Repeat until your have six (6) sets. Do not iron your seams yet.
- Between two (2) sets place one (1) main print rectangle sewing along the 5" side. Repeat until you have three rows.
- Iron the seams of all three rows one direction (left or right).
- To the top and bottom of the first row of rectangles sew an 18-1/2" main print strip. Repeat this step to one more row. Iron your seams toward the main print.
- Take your remaining row of rectangles and sew it between the sets you just created in the previous step. Iron your seams toward your main print.
- Add a 22" main print strip to the two ends of your top. Iron your seams toward your main print.



Finishing

Using either a temporary spray adhesive (or traditional basting methods) attach the wrong side of the backing fabric to one side of the batting square. Smooth out. When complete lay batting side up on your work station. Lay your quilt top wrong side down onto batting. Smooth out all three layers.

Quilt as desired. (As a reminder our sample was stitched in the ditch around each of the novelty print rectangles.)

Square up the quilt as close to the 22"x22-1/2" size as you can.

With your machine, attach the binding to the BACKSIDE of your doll blanket. Bring the binding to the FRONTSIDE and using a decorative topstitch, sew around the blanket. (Reason: if the binding is machine stitched to the blanket it will hold up for many, many washings.)

If you are more comfortable using a traditional binding method - please do so.

WOF = width of fabric - approx. 44/45"

1/4" seam allowance used throughout the pattern.
