Size approx: 20-1/2"x20-1/2"

Baby Doll Blanket #5

Fabric Requirements/Cutting Instructions

Fabrics for top: Your main print can be planned or scrappy. Choose either a single novelty print or an assortment of prints.

From a single print you need approx. three (3) 5-1/2" WOF strips. Sub-cut into sixteen (16) 5-1/2" squares.

Or - From a variety of prints you need a total of sixteen (16) 5-1/2" squares.

Your corners can also be planned or scrappy. Choose either a single, plain-bright colored fabric for each of your corners or a different color for each corner.

For one set of four (4) corners you need a scrap 2-1/2" x 10". Sub-cut into four (4) 2-1/2" squares. Total you need forty-eight (48) 2-1/2" squares.

Or - From a variety of prints you need a total of forty-eight (48) 2-1/2" squares.

There are no Borders on this blanket.

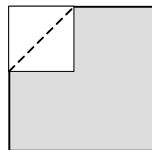
Backing: 1 piece 22"x22"

Batting: 1 piece 22"x22"

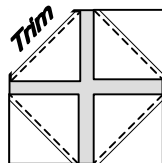
Binding: Three (3) 2-1/2" WOF strips.

Assembly

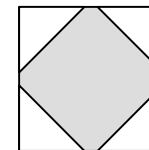
- Sew a 2-1/2" bright square to each of the four corners of the 5-1/2" main fabric square. Stitch diagonally from one corner to the other.



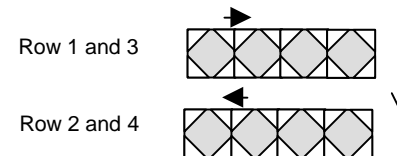
- Set your seam. Then press each corner out making sure all three (3) layers match at the raw edges.
- Trim the main fabric corner and the inside corner to 1/4". This will reduce the bulk as you assemble rows.



- This is one snowball block.
Repeat the previous steps until you have sixteen (16) snowball blocks.



- Sew four (4) snowball blocks together to make one row. Press the seam allowances in the direction of the arrows. Repeat for a total of four (4) rows.



- Once the blocks are sewn into rows; the rows can be sewn together. Sew row 1 to row 2, row 2 to row 3, and row 3 to row 4. Watch the design that appears. Press the seam allowances all in the same direction (either up or down).

Finishing

Using either a temporary spray adhesive (or traditional basting methods) attach the wrong side of the backing fabric to one side of the batting square. Smooth out. When complete lay batting side up on your work station. Lay your quilt top wrong side down onto batting. Smooth out all three layers.

Quilt as desired. (As a reminder our sample was echo quilted. Where your snowball corners come together and form a diamond. We stitched an 1/8" around the outside of each diamond.)

Square up the quilt as close to the 20-1/2" size as you can.

With your machine, attach the binding to the BACKSIDE of your doll blanket. Bring the binding to the FRONTSIDE and using a decorative topstitch, sew around the blanket. (Reason: if the binding is machine stitched to the blanket it will hold up for many, many washings.)

If you are more comfortable using a traditional binding method - please do so.

WOF = width of fabric - approx. 44/45"
1/4" seam allowance used throughout the pattern.

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
